1 Introduction

The image access method is a module which implements the recio [1] provider interface allowing the recio user interface to support a record stream from a DB2 Image Copy dataset. The access to the image copy is performed by the imageread library and support compressed as well as non-compressed backups of table spaces. The image copy dataset is expected to reside on an z/OS MVS platform.

One instance of an image access method recio stream allows a program to read the data from a given object (determined by OBID) row by row.

2 Open String Specification

As with all recio library open specification strings, three components comprise the open string: access method, object, and options name-value pairs.

For the image access method the access method name is image.

2.1 Open Specification Access Method Name

The access method name should be specified as image.

2.2 Open Specification Object Name

The object name should be a suitable file stream name on the local system. This is a dataset which contains the DB2 table space image copy.

2.3 Open Specification Option Name-Value Pairs

Consult the access method definition file for the option name-value pairs supported by the image access method. The access method definition file also supplies details of the default values (if any) of the options.

2.4 Open String Specification Examples

The following is an example of an image access method open string in which the object id of the required table in the table space image copy is 245; the file that contains the DCLGEN to be used to get the table column definitions is being referred to through a

DD-statement called DECLARE; and the image copy data is being referred to through a DD-statement called SYSBACK.

```
image(SYSBACK, dclgen='dd:DECLARE', obid=245)
```

3 image Access Method Definition

The access method definition file should be consulted for the description of the options and their default values. This includes the description of the options. The access method definition file should also be consulted for the processing modes supported by the access method.

Refer to the recio library documentation for interpreting the contents of the access definition file.

4 Environment

The location and format of the access method definition file is required to be specified by the environment variable CODEMAGUS_AMDPATH. This environment variable supplies a pattern to the full path of where access method definition (or amd) files are located. The format of the environment variable is that of a path with a %s appearing in the position in which the access method member name should appear. For example, on MVS systems this might have the form:

```
CODEMAGUS_AMDPATH='DNCT00.SRDA1.AMDFILES(%s)'
```

On a Unix-based system, the value might be set in a shell profile file such as:

```
export CODEMAGUS_AMDPATH=$HOME/bin/%s.amd
```

On Windows systems, the value might be supplied from the environment variables and look something like:

```
C:\CodeMagus\bin\%s.amd
```
